Included in this exciting performing ensemble are Nicholsen and Auerbach themselves and 4th Line favourites - the busy and multi-talented musician, actor and storyteller **Beau Dixon**; multi-instrumentalist and music supervisor **Justin Hiscox**; actor/musician **Mark Hiscox**; the wonderful singer/musician **Melissa Payne**; and instrumentalist **Saskia Tomkins**. And audiences will have the opportunity to see **Kim Blackwell** rounding out the cast. This will be Blackwell's first acting appearance in a 4th Line show since 1998.

Rebecca Auerbach, Co-Playwright/Actor/Musician
Rebecca is an award-winning actor, singer, writer, music and theatre maker. She has performed across the country at The National Arts Centre, Bard on the Beach, The Arts Club, Caravan Farm, The Grand Theatre, Theatre Calgary, Alberta Theatre Projects, RMTC, WJT, Factory Theatre, Summerworks, Musical Stage Company, Studio 180, Nightwood, Globe Theatre, nine seasons with The Blyth Festival among many others. Highlights include: The Pigeon King (Blyth Festival/National Arts Centre); The Wild Party (Musical Stage/Obsidian/Dora Award nomination); Onegin (Musical Stage/National Arts Centre/Dora Nomination); Bittergirl (Charlottetown Festival/The Citadel/MTC). Rebecca is currently developing a show about the women of CKNX for Blyth Festival as well as her solo piece, "Discount Dave and the Fix"

about our obsession with celebrity, and what it means to be a "good-time gal". She has been nominated for three Jessie Awards, two Dora Awards, a Betty, a Calgary Critics Award and was the recipient of the Jessie Award for Most Promising Newcomer. Rebecca is a graduate of Studio 58.

Kim Blackwell, 4th Line Theatre's Managing Artistic Director/Actor

Kim Blackwell is 4th Line Theatre's Managing Artistic Director and is a veteran 4th Line director/producer – 2022 will mark her 28th season with 4th Line Theatre where she has directed 26 productions including 14 world premieres. Selected credits include: Artistic Director (2014 - Present), Artistic Producer (2009 – 2014), Artistic Associate (2001-2009), directing: *The Verandah Society in Residence at*



4th Line Theatre (2021); Bedtime Stories & Other Horrifying Tales (2020); The Fool of Cavan: A Christmas Caper, Bloom: A Rock 'n' Roll Fable (2019), The Other: A Strange Christmas Tale (2018), The Shadow Walk of Millbrook (2016, 2018), Who Killed Snow White? (2018), The Hero of Hunter Street (2016), The Bad Luck Bank Robbers (2015, 2016), The Real McCoy (2013), Queen Marie, St. Francis of Millbrook (2012), The Berlin Blues (2011), The Right Road to Pontypool (2009, 2010), Schoolhouse (2007, 2008), The Art of Silent Killing, That Summer, Crow Hill, The Cavan Blazers, Attrition, Gimme That Prime Time Religion and many development workshops. She directed plays across Canada and the US. Her play A Daughter had its world premiere in 2020 as a part of the Open Spaces Theatre Festival and was selected to be a part of the International Rural Women's Studies Conference hosted by University of Guelph in 2021.



Beau Dixon, Actor/Musician

Beau Dixon is an award-winning, self-taught actor, musician, singer/songwriter, playwright, music director and sound designer. As an actor and musician, he's performed on numerous theatre stages throughout Canada, the U.S and Europe. He has received two Dora Mavor Moore Awards, a Calgary and Toronto Critic's Award, and he has been a finalist for the KM Hunter Award. His most recent play *Bloom: A Rock 'n' Roll Fable*, was produced at 4th Line Theatre in summer of 2019. 


Mark Hiscox, Actor/Musician Mark has been involved with

Melissa Payne, Actor/Musician

Ennismore, Ontario's Melissa Payne has truly left her mark on the musical landscape, and she's just getting started. Her background in old time fiddle and traditional Celtic music has evolved into a blossoming solo career, including three full length albums including her most recently released album "Darker Than Your Dark". Her live performances have garnered her critical acclaim, and notable guest collaborators like Blue Rodeo's Greg Keelor, James McKenty, Matt Mays, Natalie

MacMaster, cellist Nathaniel Smith and Jimmy Bowskill of The Sheepdogs, have her working with some of the biggest names in Canada, and beyond. Payne appeared as Audrey in 4th Line Theatre's 2019 production of Ian McLachlan and Robert Winslow's *Carmel*.



Saskia Tomkins, Actor/Musician

This is Saskia's seventh production at 4th Line Theatre - it feels good to be back! Saskia is a master musician of Violin/Fiddle Viola, Cello and Nyckelharpa. She is classically trained with a folk background and a B.A.(Honours) degree in Music (Jazz), and she won All Britain Champion Irish Fiddler. Saskia recently was called a Swiss army knife of strings, and has had the privilege of working with many names including more recently: Sultans of String, Jimmy Bowskill, "Jabbour", Ted Staunton, James McKenty, Kate Suhr, and David Newland. Her theatre work includes: Originating the "Celtic-ifying" of the

Broadway hit *Come From Away*; The English Shakespeare Company and Michael Bogdanov; 4th Line Theatre; Sadler's Wells Theatre, London UK. Saskia's current personal projects include Steafan & Saskia with Steafan Hannigan, the instrumental jazz/roots duo 2ish, with Brandon Scott Besharah; the jazz trio Marsala and the Imports, and a bowed-string chamber band Medusa. She is currently principle 2nd violin for Quinte Symphony Orchestra. Saskia also teaches privately from her home near Cobourg and runs workshops at festivals.
