# **Managing Artistic Director's Message**

WHAT A TRULY SPECIAL SEASON 2024 WAS!!! If you were able to join us, thank you so much for coming! We are continuing to rebuild our audiences and there is still a ways to go, but we are headed in the right direction!! Thank you to everyone who came out this summer and supported Canadian theatre. And we did not lose even one show to rain!

We again produced two world premieres. We opened the 2024 summer season with Alison Lawrence's Onion Skins & Peach Fuzz: The Farmerettes based on Bonnie Sitter and Shirleyan English's book. We hosted many former Farmerettes and their families to celebrate the stories of these amazing young women! What a joy to finally bring Alison, Bonnie and Shirleyan's beautiful words and memories to the stage. In August, we premiered Beverley Cooper's Jim Watts: Girl Reporter. The stunning cast of 30 performers transfixed audiences with this epic tale of ideology, war and social change. As I write this letter, Jim Watts seems particularly prescient. I am proud of the plays we produced this summer and the people who brought them to life. And we even had a revolving stage! What a feat of engineering and construction.

It was glorious to welcome audiences to the Winslow Farm, to experience original Canadian stories under the sun on warm Ontario nights. Gathering together in shared experiences reminded me how important our community is to our physical and mental health and well-being.

We involved 20 volunteer actors as part of the artistic team this year, many of them members of our Young Company through our Emerging VOICES program. Year after year, I love watching community performers blossom as both artists and humans during their time at 4th Line.

And now, as the weather turns a bit colder, I turn my attention to 2025 and our 33rd summer season. I am proud to announce two world premiere plays which have been developed through our new play development program. In July, we will present the world premiere of Robert Winslow and Ian McLachlan's *The Housekeeper*. It is 1955 and a mysterious woman arrives in Millbrook. Eleanor Gwyn is looking for a job, and becoming the housekeeper for widower Walter White might be the perfect fit. Eleanor is hoping to put down roots, find a place to call home and make a fresh start in her life. But is Millbrook ready for Eleanor and her progressive world views? Founder Robert Winslow will be directing this play.

Then in August, I am excited to direct the world premiere of Megan Murphy's *Wild Irish Geese*. Murphy's play is highly anticipated and sure to be an instant hit. The production will be a part of the 200th commemoration of the arrival of the first of the Peter Robinson Irish settlers in 1825. Descendants of these original Irish settlers are being invited to return to the region in the summer of 2025 to pay homage to their forebears. 4th Line is proud to be part of these important anniversary events. Oh, and Megan will be starring in the production as well!

This season's plays will focus on people who are in search of new lands, towns and homes. They are people with a desperate desire to find a place to call their own. Whether a person or people come from



across an ocean or the province, many are escaping persecution and abuse in search of safe and secure lives for themselves and their families. We know this settler history can be complex and we are sensitive to this challenge.

But up first, I am thrilled to be directing the latest iteration of Megan Murphy and Kate Suhr's beloved *The Verandah Society*. This holiday version, entitled *Up to Snow Good*, will run from December 11-15, 2024 at the Peterborough Theatre Guild. The show will be filled with Megan's funny and thoughtful stories, and Kate's ethereal music. Justin Hiscox will musical direct! And there will be many surprise guests. What an event it will be!

The theatre is a precious place where transformative experiences are shared between artists and audiences. This relationship is at the heart of everything we do. I hope you can join us soon!

Barnardo series. In *The Housekeeper*, former Barnardo boy Walter White hires a housekeeper from away to work for him on his farm just south of Millbrook, the same farm featured in our last Barnardo play entitled *Carmel. The Housekeeper* will open the 2025 summer season.

Meanwhile, I have been researching a couple of other locally-based plays for possible future production at 4th Line. Firstly, I am working on a play about my old high school, Millbrook High, which existed from 1961 until 1992. It has been great connecting with former staff and students ranging in age from the forties to the early nineties. I envision a play with lots of original songs from the period and a wide variety of scenes and characters. Also I have been researching a play about the Prince of Wales' royal tour through this area in 1860. Just 18, lively Prince Albert (later King Edward VII) had a whirlwind of a couple of days passing through Cobourg, Hiawatha First Nation, Peterborough, Millbrook and Port Hope.

the spirit of a fairy tale as the Prince becomes lost in the woods south of Millbrook after carefully avoiding the Orangemen of



Millbrook led by the Cavan Blazers.

I am also looking forward to a January reading of a play, which I researched and developed during the pandemic. This play entitled *Courage*, follows the Jewish prisoners in Treblinka Death Camp in Poland during World War II as they plan and carry out an uprising against their Nazi captors.

And Ian McLachlan and I have begun work on our final Barnardo series play, tentatively entitled *The End*, which follows former Barnardo boys Billy and Walter into the world of long-term care. I am dedicating this final play to my dear friend and fatherin-law Chester Froncz who passed away this past July in Extendicare, Cobourg.
